Our Sierra Club Group Works to Keep Members Informed and Engaged on Local Environmental Issues

HAT are some of the things that our local Sierra Club provides? Adding the Sierra Club's Voice in Local Conservation Matters

In our region, there are often projects, plans, and policies that determine how public and private forests are managed. The Tuolumne Group of the Sierra Club networks with the Central Sierra Environmental Resource Center, the Tuolumne River Trust, and Central Sierra Audubon to provide public input for local issues of importance.

In particular, the Tuolumne Group in recent years has emphasized the Club's opposition to the logging of large trees in the national forest. Both the national Sierra Club and the local group support the establishment of a National Old Growth Forest policy to protect large old trees on federal forest lands. Our local Group has also taken a very clear position that opposes the widespread spraying of herbicides in the national forest. There is a highly diverse range of views about the purported safety or the potential health risks of chemical treatments, but the Tuolumne Group supports a policy of avoiding chemical use on public forest lands.

Our local Club periodically submits comments for other environmental issues that periodically arise in order to reflect the national policies of the Sierra Club. Individual members of the management committee also donate their time to attend local area collaborative stakeholder groups that work to get grants and congressional funding for recreational facilities, watershed projects, fuel reduction treatments, and other broadly supported local needs.

When public input is requested on a local environmental issue, we alert our membership, and use our website and newsletter to direct and enable members to make their voices heard.

Bringing Together Those Who Love the Outdoors, Holding Programs, Contributing Scholarships, and More...

Since COVID, our local Group has not had formally designated outings scheduled. We are working with the Chapter to gain outings leader certifications to enable a return to regular outings. But thanks to years of past outings leadership by Bob Asquith, many Sierra Club members have enjoyed group outings or have built personal connections with others who share a passion for hiking. Our Tuolumne Group has worked with Columbia College to provide Sierra Club Foundation funding for scholarships for students who have a passion for natural resources and our local region. With your support, we hope to continue.

Our local Sierra Club has also begun offering periodic programs again at the main Tuolumne County library to enable our members and the general public to enjoy conservation-connected presentations. We featured best-selling author Andrea Lankford last fall, and National Geographic photographer Phil Schermeister in April. The number of programs is directly limited by having sufficient funding to advertise upcoming presentations with Tuolumne Group newsletters and to pay associated costs.
